This is an overview of what your child will be learning in the second half of Term 1. We would be happy to discuss with you how you can best support your child with their learning and celebrate their achievements, and have added some additional ideas for support within each curriculum area (in green).

WHAT YOUR CHILD NEEDS TO BRING

(Make sure to label all items with your child's name)

- 1) PE Kit Bring & take home on Tuesdays. Shoes can stay at school.

- 3) A water bottle labelled with your child's name.

Homework

Homework is given out each Thursday and should be handed in by Monday night. It will include one piece of English and one piece of Maths revising topics that were covered in class. Pupils will also have 5 vocabulary words to learn each week. You are able to print off the homework so your child is able to write on the worksheets and then take a photo of the work that they produce. Children should read at home each night and discuss the story with an adult. Children will also be able to take at least one library book home from Mr Hall's library each Thursday for G1Y and Wednesday for G1G.

Please note that homework is intended as reinforcement of what your child has learnt and should not be completed by the parent! Should your child have any difficulty completing any tasks set, please inform your child's teacher. G1 – G6 will be using an English curriculum based around 9 Themed Units to study over the school year.

You Can: Read every night at home. Read poems and look out for signs and instructions in English around you. You can work on phonics by asking children to break up sounds in words and blend sounds together when reading.

You Can: practise counting objects in tens and ones, looking at numbers around them and estimating how many objects there are in a group. You can add and subtract different numbers within 100 using manipulatives, number lines and part whole models. If you would like some extra resources please contact your child's teacher.
